
## Rain Gardens in Lake Saint Louis

As cities and suburbs grow, and replace forests and agricultural land, increased stormwater runoff from impervious surfaces becomes a problem. Stormwater runoff from developed surfaces increases flooding, carries pollutants from streets, parking lots, and even lawns into local streams and lakes, and leads to costly municipal improvements in stormwater treatment structures.

Homeowners across the country are catching on to rain gardens - landscaped areas planted to native flowers and other native vegetation that soak up rain water, mainly from the roof of a house or erosion areas. The rain garden fills with a few inches of water after a storm and water slowly filters into the ground rather than running off into a storm drain.

Compared to conventional lawns, a rain garden allows about 30% more water to soak into the ground. By reducing stormwater runoff, rain gardens can be a valuable part of changing these trends.

While an individual rain garden may seem like a small thing, collectively they produce substantial neighborhood and community environmental benefits. Rain gardens work for us in several ways: increases the amount of water that filters into the ground, protects communities from flooding and drainage problems, protects streams and lakes from pollutants carried from urban stormwater (especially fertilizers and pesticides), enhances the beauty of lawns and neighborhood, and provides valuable habitat for



birds, butterflies, and beneficial insects. Rain gardens do not form ponds, do not breed mosquitoes, require little maintenance, and are not expensive.

### PUBLIC HEARINGS

Application of a proposed Site Plan Review to construct three (3) 4,800 square foot single-story metal canopy structures, twenty-seven (27) 13.5' x 27.75' concrete storage bins, and new gravel on site at Lake Saint Louis Garden Center. The total acreage of the site is 7.833 acres and zoned CB (Community Business). The property is located south of Waterford Villas subdivision, east of The Meadows at Lake Saint Louis shopping center, and approximately a half mile northwest of MO-364/I-64 interchange. Application submitted by Richard Kopp. CLOSED

Application for proposed Amendments to Municipal Code Section 410.110 and/or other appropriate sections of the Code allowing basketball goals. Application submitted by City of Lake Saint Louis. CONTINUED

Bill No. 3727 - An ordinance authorizing City Staff to conduct an auction to dispose of one (1) surplus Public Works Department 2008 F550 truck with plow and salt spreader for the City of

Bill No. 3733 - An ordinance of the City of Lake Saint Louis, Missouri, authorizing and directing the Missouri Department of Revenue to resume application and collection of the local sales tax on the titling of motor vehicles, trailers, boats, and outboard motors that were purchased from a source other than a licensed Missouri dealer.

Resolution No. 04-18-16 (1) - A resolution approving a grant application requesting funds from the U.S. Department of Justice for a Bulletproof Vest Grant on behalf of the City of Lake Saint Louis, Missouri.

Resolution No. 04-18-16 (2) - A resolution imposing a one hundred eighty (180) day moratorium on the acceptance and processing of applications for permitting, construction, or issuance of approval of new wireless communication support towers.
